We have some exciting news to share with you regarding the next Half Ton Classics Cup in Nieuwpoort (BEL): we have secured a main sponsor for the event!

Belgium's Brussels based general construction company 'In Advance' has agreed to link up its name with our regatta.

#### **Halftonners will Think Pink**

We are also embarking on a completely new itinerary: the HTCE is teaming up with Think Pink, a European-wide organization which aims to improve the lives of breast cancer patients and their family by raising awareness, informing, defending patient's rights, funding scientific research into breast cancer and funding care and aftercare programs.

The HTCE will support this organization via 'Sailing for Think Pink', an organization of young Belgian woman whose objectives are firstly to support Think Pink by raising funds & secondly promoting the presence of women in sailing, via their racing team 'Swanne Bonny'.

The Sailing for Think Pink team will be present the whole week. During the traditional gala dinner on Friday 9/8 they will present themselves, their goals and their dreams...

In view of the above we are proud to announce the presence of already 2 all-female teams: one from Norway on board an X-95 and one Belgian 'Think Pink' team on a Berret-designed halftonner.

We encourage our Brittany, Irish and UK teams to follow their examples and register for the event.

#### **Practical hints:**

- Campers can stay at the KYCN premises at a cost of 25 EUR per day
- Cranage for halftonners coming on a trailer is free, thanks to Tom/ Yachting Wave. Trailers can be stored for free at his yard (hint: Tom loves a good red wine...)
- All halftonners will be berthed at 1 same pier in the KYCN yacht harbour
- Hotel boats are required to make a timely reservation at the Clubs office via <u>info@kycn.be</u> – regular visitor's tariffs will apply (it is high season after all)
- Housing in the vicinity can be easily found via the web/Air B&B/camping sites/holiday parks (Ysermonde) or the main agencies in Nieuwpoort (Immo Eecke, ...) We advise booking your housing well in advance. If you need guidance, contact us.
- For the halftonners coming by ferry from Norway to Zeebrugge: the HTCE is looking into a service to retrieve your boats from the terminal (and bringing them back after the event).

## Navigational guidelines for a Nieuwpoort 'dummy'

Beware! The HTCC 2024 will be sailed during a spring tide regime.

So, when approaching the entrance channel from the sea, beware of the (strong) side current when engaging in between the wooden piers.

Make sure your boat engine is in 100% working order, as the current in the entrance channel (especially at the storm barrier) can be quite strong (upto 3 knots).

The current at sea is eastbound starting from +/- 3 hours before HW until 3 hours after HW.

When 'rounding the cans' always mind the tidal current (most 'cans' are steel cans...).

At all times stay out of the sea farm area +/- 3NM West of the harbour entrance (area marked by cardinal buoys – supplied by the Irish company JFC Marine, one of the sponsors).

Always have a black cone hoisted (pointing downwards) when using engine + sail(s) up in the entrance channel. Police are checking and fines are quite high. Also for Norwegians.

Sandbanks do exist off Nieuwpoort, the Spanish Armada already found out in 1588... Thank God the main race area is avoiding the shallowest parts. They, however, represent quite a few tactical opportunities during a race, much to the pleasure of the local halftonner teams.







The effects of 'wind against tide' can produce quite steep seas. In a blow, prepare to get wet.

Professional maritime traffic off Nieuwpoort exists but is rather reduced to one or two sand carrying vessels who collect sand at sea and bring it to the Nieuwpoort harbour, upstream the Yser river. When they navigate through the entrance channel please give ample room.

A small ferry operates on the entrance channel and can be quite busy during the local summer holidays. Please give ample room – get out of their way.

When having dinner in the KYCN clubhouse you will notice a nice chart on your place mats. Just pointing out here that this map is outdated and cannot be used for navigational purposes (although it has been done in the past...).

At sea, never follow the locals 😌.
