From our side (the organizers) we've already had a detailed debriefing with all concerning parties (shore team, club, race committee, ...). For the future we'll take into account following remarks:

- Enhancing the regatta format with more diverse courses;
- More emphasizing the results for the non-modified halftonners, because they are an essential part in the revival of our Class;
- In addition tot he above a special & separate ranking and trophy will be mandatory as from next HTCC events:
- Besides that we'll continue to encourage modifications that make our halftonners more performant in other IRC championships;
- We remain in contact with both IRC rating offices. Our 2 fleets are complementary but difficult to harmonize.
- Communications between the race committee and the sailors must be enhanced further.
- The Class' board will review the Class Rules and present an updated set of rules for the next AGM.

IRISH FLEET

We've received a notice that AR BIR (Joubert 1980) has been sold to Laurent Mermier and will be sailed from Port-Louis (Lorient). Welcome to the Class Laurent!

Free Lance (winner of the 1983 Half Ton Cup in Hankø) is currently undergoing a complete refit, so she will be faster than ever in 2025.

Normally a strong fleet composed of a.o. Daltoner, Diablesse, Cardiac Blues and Cortegada will participate at next year's Spi Ouest France in La Trinité-sur-Mer. With 8 halftonners we can have our own starts & ranking!

BELGIAN FLEET

In Belgium, after witnessing the success of our fleet in Nieuwpoort, we would not be surprised to see 3 new teams next year... Let's hope this all materializes and that we can send a strong delegation to Torquay.

One who has not been waiting very long is Jeremy Florizoone (at the helm of RED CLOUD): he convinced the ownerd of CONCORDE to sell him their boat right after the HTCC. A few weeks later he was crowned Belgian Champion in the Half Ton Class after 2 races sailed in very light conditions in Ostend.
