THE 2025 HTCC

Some very important news regarding a place-to-stay during the next HTCC in Torquay.

As local holiday housing is scarse, the local organizers and the HTCE have prebooked rooms in the Imperial Hotel Torquay and the Hampton by Hilton Hotel Torquay.

In order to ensure the event is as affordable and social as possible, we have obtained a significant discount for accommodation at both hotels, which are at very short walk - less than 6 minutes to both the Marina where the boats will be moored for the event and also to the Royal Torbay Yacht Club.

The price for a 2-bed room with breakfast included, from Saturday 2nd August PM to Saturday 9th August AM at the Imperial Hotel, is £930 (which is much less than similar hotels nearby).

At the Imperial 30 rooms are pre-booked and can be reserved during the next 12 weeks. The hotel will accept a non-returnable deposit of £50 per room with payment during the event. In order to obtain this discounted offer please use the identifier HTC.

A similar discount (£134 per night so £938 for 7 days B&B) was obtained at the Hampton by Hilton Hotel Torquay, also within short walking distance from the Marina and Yacht Club, for 25 rooms, some of which may sleep 3 at the same rate. We did not obtain the same deposit facility here.

Given we are hoping for 25 boats and thus 175 crew members, if we all stayed at the hotel we would need 90 rooms. Given it is before New Year there are this number of rooms available but beyond the 55 guaranteed for 6 weeks after New Year these offers will not continue. So please book early with a deposit as we think having all the teams close to each other will help the feel of the event.

<u>Peter Rutter</u> (sailing QUOKKA IX) is the local head of the organizing team. He informs as follows:

The 2025 Half Ton Classics Cup is to be held at the city of Torquay, in the waters of Torbay, from Saturday 2nd to Friday the 8th August 2025. Being in Devon, you have as good a climate as the UK can give you.

As I have said the waters of Torbay are sheltered from the prevailing winds and have little tide effect which makes the racing tighter and more exciting. My club and I are looking forward to greeting you to this event which we are all looking forward to. Although it is early I want you to be aware of our intended schedule and offers for

Accommodation (see above), which we have arranged to be available, if booked early.

We have arranged that the pontoon with direct shoreside access on the northside of the harbour will be available for the fleet with electricity. This will be free from Saturday to Saturday, but competitive rates can be arranged for stays outside these dates. Crane launch and mast step and also spray off is being arranged in the harbour, as well as recovery at end of event.
