


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## THE 2025 HTCC

We'll all remember the fantastic yacht club, the excellent race committee, the fabulous pontoon drink, the delicious BBQ on the Club's terrace, the challenging wind conditions in Torbay, the spectacular and long spinnaker run of the offshore race...

A big applause to Peter Rutter for bringing that all together...



We were delighted to see many new faces around In Torquay, many French who crossed the Channel, a Norwegian X-95 that sailed from Belgium (and back to Norway after the event!), 4 Belgian teams, some British and 2 Irish who drove down from their island with a black and an orange boat, one with a fixed propeller shaft, and the other without...

The orange boat named 2 FARR came, saw and ... won, with a clear margin. A light blue boat with the beautiful name PER ELISA showed incredible boat speed, venerable GENERAL TAPIOCA demonstrated that crew age still rhymes with performance, ... but what most surprised us was that small old white French half tonner, with the smallest handicap but brilliantly sailed by her crew resulting in a 1st place in the overall Vintage fleet... a huge applause for the team of INSOLENT!

The main trophy, the Half Ton True Spirit Trophy, was awarded to the youth team with OPLITE, sailing over from Brittany, sleeping on board, ... perfectly in line with the old days...

Sure all teams enjoyed their stay at the English Riviera to such a degree that many will turn up in Hankø in a few months...



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## NEWS FROM THE AGM

During the AGM the main topic on the agenda was of course the updated Class Rules. After a long debate, it was finally decided to stick largely to the last version of the text proposed in February 2025, albeit with some clarifications.

The new class rules will be effective on the 1st of February 2026. They will be published on the Class' website under the Class-tab in Class documents

In short:

Number of pro's on board (WS Cat 1) can be maximum 2: the owner + 1. If the owner is not a pro, then only 1 pro can sail on board during a Class event. In case of a rented boat, the 'owner' is replaced by 'the representative'.

You can still sail with 1 more than the crew number stated on your endorsed IRC certificate on the condition that the extra member is a 'youngster' of max 21 years old at the start of the event. This age limit was 18 years until now.

The Class still promotes youth teams sailing on a half tonner.

For the vintage boats there will be a proper trophy at the prizegiving.

Stop the eternal rating discussions and offer an endorsed IRC rating certificate to your half tonner. ... The measurement process might be time consuming, but it offers the advantage of having a fair & correct IRC rating.

Remember that to enter your boat for the HTCC, you need such a certificate.



### BELGIAN FLEET

Latest 'addition' to the BEL-fleet, TOM POUCE, after a 10-month long refit, made its debut during the local end-of-season 'Antwerp Race' on 18th October, just 10 days after her re-launching. Racing in the cruiser-racer class (as the IRC endorsed from 2024 was really obsolete), the blue/white Berret 1978 half tonner lead the 43 boat fleet for the entire race, securing victory both in real as in corrected time.

In IRC class 3 GENERAL TAPIOCA finished 2nd on corrected and HALFAJET, with an entire novice crew, finished 8th.

Sure that by spring 2026 we'll also have more news from the Nieuwpoort fleet...


